



MARC UZAN Executive Director, Reinventing Bretton Woods Committee

Marc Uzan is Executive Director and founder of the Reinventing Bretton Woods Committee, a non-profit established in 1994 to foster high-level dialogue on the international financial architecture. Under his leadership, RBWC convenes global conferences and builds partnerships with central banks, governments, and research institutions worldwide.

An editor and author on international finance, his recent works include *Regional Integration in Central Asia* (2024), *The New Kazakhstan* (2023), *Bretton Woods: The Next 70 Years* (2015), and *The Ten Years After* (2018). Mr. Uzan holds a master's in international economics and finance from Université Paris-Dauphine and has been a visiting scholar at the University of California, Berkeley, and a visiting fellow at Harvard University.



RICCARDO ERCOLI Executive Director for Albania International Monetary Fund

Riccardo Ercoli is Executive Director at the IMF for the constituency of Italy, Albania, Greece, Malta, Portugal, and San Marino. He previously headed the Technical Secretariat of the Italian Minister of Economy and Finance, working closely with authorities on Fund matters.

Earlier, he held roles at the European Commission and the Budget Committee of the Italian Senate, and in 2015 served in Athens as Resident Public Financial Management Expert with the IMF's Fiscal Affairs Department. He holds a doctorate in economic policy and public finance (University of Rome) and a master's in econometrics (ISAE, Rome).



GIAN MARIA MILESI-FERRETTI

Senior fellow Hutchins Center on Fiscal and Monetary Policy, Brookings Institution

Gian Maria Milesi-Ferretti is a Senior Fellow at the Hutchins Center on Fiscal and Monetary Policy, following his role as Deputy Director in the IMF Research Department (2014–2021). A seasoned economist, he spent nearly three decades at the IMF, including a term as mission chief to the United States.

Dr. Milesi-Ferretti holds a Ph.D. from Harvard University. He is a highly published expert on international capital flows and financial integration, with his co-authored paper, "The External Wealth of Nations Mark II," earning the Bhagwati award.



PIROSKA NAGY MOHÁCSI Visiting Professor in Practice London School of Economics and Political Science

She previously served as Interim Director of the LSE Institute for Global Affairs (2015–2021) and is an Academic Partner to the Macroeconomic Advisory Group.

Her career spans senior roles at the EBRD (Director for Policy, 2008–2015) and over two decades at the IMF (1986–2008), leading programs across emerging Europe, Russia, and Africa. She has also been a Senior Adviser at Fitch Ratings. A leading expert on monetary and fiscal policy, financial innovation, and digital currencies, she co-created the Vienna Initiative, a public-private platform for cross-border crisis management, and is the author of *The Meltdown of the Russian State*.



Gabriel FELBERMAYR Professor and Director Austrian Institute of Economic Research

Gabriel Felbermayr is Director of WIFO in Vienna and a University Professor at WU Vienna. He previously served as President of the Kiel Institute for the World Economy (2019–2021) and headed the ifo Center for International Economics in Munich (2010–2019), where he was also a professor at LMU. Earlier roles include a chair in international economics at the University of Hohenheim (2009–2010), academic advisor at the University of Tübingen (2005–2008), and consultant with McKinsey & Company in Vienna (2004–2005).

He studied economics and trade at the University of Linz and holds a PhD from the University of Florence. His research focuses on international trade, European integration, and economic policy.



NATIA TURNAVA Governor National Bank of Georgia

Natia Turnava is Governor and Chair of the Board of the National Bank of Georgia (since February 2025). She joined the Board in 2022 and previously served as Acting Governor and First Vice-Governor, helping steer monetary policy and financial sector oversight during a period of structural change.

Before the NBG, she was Georgia's Minister of Economy and Sustainable Development (2019–2022) and held senior roles across the public and private sectors, including the Partnership Fund and the Georgian Industrial Group. She holds a PhD in Economics and an MBA from the University of Cumbria (UK). Her policy interests span growth, competitiveness, financial stability, and sustainable development.



GENT SEJKO Governor Bank of Albania

Gent Sejko has served as Governor of the Bank of Albania and Chair of its Supervisory Council since February 2015, and was re-elected in 2022. He also serves as Albania's IMF Governor and sits on the World Bank Group's MIGA, representing the country in international financial fora.

His career spans central banking and commercial finance: before becoming Governor he was Deputy General Manager at Société Générale Albania and held senior roles at the Bank of Albania, Raiffeisen Bank, and National Commercial Bank. He holds an MAcc in International Accounting and Financial Management from the University of Glasgow (1997). He authored the 2022 book *The Central Bank and its Policies in the Covid-19 Era: Future Challenges*.



ALFRED KAMMER Director of the European Department International Monetary Fund

Alfred Kammer has led the IMF's European Department since August 2020, overseeing the Fund's engagement across Europe. He previously served as Chief of Staff to the Managing Director; Deputy Director in both the Strategy, Policy and Review Department and the Middle East and Central Asia Department; and Director of the Office of Technical Assistance Management. He also worked as Advisor to a Deputy Managing Director and as the IMF's Resident Representative in Russia.

Across his IMF career, Mr. Kammer has supported countries in Africa, Asia, Europe, and the Middle East on macroeconomic policy, crisis response, surveillance, program design, and capacity development, bringing a broad strategic perspective to economic and financial issues.



PRIMOŽ DOLENC Acting Governor Banka Slovenije

Primož Dolenc is Vice-Governor and member of the Governing Board of Banka Slovenije. Appointed to a first six-year term by the National Assembly in 2016 and reappointed in November 2022, he has served as Deputy Governor since 2017 and, as of January 2025, is temporarily leading the central bank for the second time. He is also a member of the General Board of the European Systemic Risk Board (ESRB).

Mr. Dolenc holds bachelor's, master's, and doctoral degrees in economics from the University of Ljubljana, specializing in state asset and debt management. Before joining the central bank, he held senior roles in the state treasury and commercial banks and was a professor and researcher at the University of Primorska.



JASMINA SELIMOVIĆ

Governor

Central Bank of Bosnia and Herzegovina

Jasmina Selimović has served as Governor of the Central Bank of Bosnia and Herzegovina since January 2024. Born in Sarajevo, she earned her BA, MA, and PhD in actuarial science at the University of Sarajevo School of Economics and Business (SEBS). An academic leader at SEBS since 2004, she has held roles including Vice Dean and, since 2018 (renewed in 2022), Dean of the School.

Her expertise spans financial stability, actuarial science, and higher-education quality assurance. She works as an international accreditation expert across EU countries and holds licenses as a court expert in economics, an internal auditor for banks and financial institutions, and a certified actuary.



IRENA RADOVIĆ

Governor

Central Bank of Montenegro

Irena Radović has served as Governor of the Central Bank of Montenegro since December 2023 - the first woman in the role. She is steering Montenegro's integration into the Single Euro Payments Area (SEPA) and aligning financial regulation with the EU acquis to advance EU accession. A career economist with over two decades in central banking and international affairs, she previously served as Deputy Governor of the CBCG, Ambassador to France and UNESCO, and Deputy Foreign Minister.

Dr. Radović holds a PhD in Economics and an MPhil from the University of Cambridge. A committed advocate for inclusion, she authored Montenegro's National Agenda for Women's Economic Empowerment and serves as G100 Global Chair for Financial Inclusion.



DEBORA REVOLTELLA Chief Economist European Investment Bank

Debora Revoltella leads the EIB's Economics Department, overseeing flagship publications such as the EIB Investment Report. She founded and directs the EIB Investment Survey, which tracks investment dynamics across more than 12,000 European firms, informing policy and market debate.

Previously, she taught macroeconomics at Bocconi University, worked at Banca Commerciale Italiana, and served as Chief Economist for Central & Eastern Europe at UniCredit. She holds a degree, a master's, and a PhD in economics from Bocconi University and the University of Ancona. Ms. Revoltella sits on the boards of the Vienna Initiative, CompNet, SUERF, and the Euro 50 Group.



LULJETA MINXHOZI First Deputy Governor Bank of Albania

Prof. Dr. Luljeta Minxhozi has served as First Deputy Governor of the Bank of Albania since 9 January 2019, after joining the Supervisory Council in December 2018. She graduated in Economics from the University of Tirana in 1982 and was awarded the title of Professor in 2011, complementing her formation with numerous academic programs across Europe.

An educator and scholar since 1982, she has held senior academic posts including Dean of the Faculty of Economics at the European University of Tirana (2008–2018) and Vice Rector of Luarasi University (2018). She has taught economics and finance at multiple universities, authored studies, textbooks, and monographs, and frequently delivers lectures at national and international conferences.



MARTIN GALSTYAN

Governor

Central Bank of Armenia

Martin Galstyan has served as Governor of the Central Bank of Armenia since 2020, following service as a CBA Board Member. He began his career at the CBA in 1998 and held senior roles including Head of the Statistics Department and the first Head of the Dilijan Research Center (2015), where he advanced data-driven policy and research capacity.

He holds degrees in economics (BA/PhD) from Yerevan State University and an MPA from Harvard University's John F. Kennedy School of Government. An award-winning lecturer at the American University of Armenia, he teaches courses affiliated with Harvard Business School. Mr. Galstyan is active in professional life and public initiatives, including community development foundations in Armenia.



EDWARD SCICLUNA Governor Central Bank of Malta

Edward Scicluna was appointed Governor of the Central Bank of Malta in 2021 and sits on the ECB's Governing Council. He also represents Malta as Governor or Alternate Governor at the IMF, EBRD, AIIB, and World Bank. Previously, he served as Malta's Minister for Finance (2013–2020), was a Member of the European Parliament and Vice-Chair of ECON - helping draft the report establishing the European Stability Mechanism -and chaired the EIB Board of Governors in 2013.

Before public office, Professor Scicluna was Professor and Head of Economics at the University of Malta, Chairperson of the Malta Financial Services Authority, and a CBM Board Director. He holds a PhD in Economics from the University of Toronto and a diploma from the University of Oxford.



GEDIMINAS ŠIMKUS Governor Bank of Lithuania

Gediminas Šimkus has chaired the Board of Lietuvos bankas (Bank of Lithuania) since April 2021, overseeing monetary policy, economic analysis, and organizational management. He began his career at the central bank in 2002 and has built deep expertise in financial stability and the design and implementation of monetary and macroprudential policies. From 2010 to 2012, he served at the European Central Bank as a financial stability expert.

Over more than two decades in public service, Mr. Šimkus has contributed to evidence-based policymaking and resilient financial-sector frameworks in Lithuania. He holds a Master's degree in Economics from Vilnius University.



TRAJKO SLAVESKI

Governor

National Bank of the Republic of North Macedonia

Trajko Slaveski, Ph.D. (b. 1960, Ohrid) is a full professor at the Faculty of Economics, Ss. Cyril and Methodius University in Skopje. An alumnus of the same faculty, he pursued postgraduate studies at California State University and Harvard University (1989/90) and has served as a visiting professor, including postgraduate teaching in Athens.

A key figure in North Macedonia's early economic policymaking, he co-authored the 1992 Anti-Inflation Program that stabilized the economy and introduced the denar. He later served as Minister of Development (1999–2000) and Minister of Finance (2006–2009), launching the flat tax and modernizing the payment system. He has represented the country as Governor for the World Bank and EBRD and, in 2021, was elected President of the Skopje City Council.



MÁRIO CENTENO Former Governor Banco de Portugal

Mário Centeno served as Governor of Banco de Portugal and member of the ECB's Governing Council from July 2020 to October 2025. Previously, he was President of the Eurogroup and Chair of the ESM Board of Governors (2018–2020) and Portugal's Minister of Finance (2015–2020).

An economist by training, Mr. Centeno began his career at Banco de Portugal in 1993, later holding several leadership roles. He is currently a collaborator at Banco de Portugal and a full professor. He holds a PhD in Economics from Harvard University and has published widely in macroeconomics and labor economics, contributing to European fiscal governance and Portugal's post-crisis reforms.



NATASHA AHMETAJ Second Deputy Governor Bank of Albania

Dr. Natasha Ahmetaj has served as Second Deputy Governor of the Bank of Albania since May 2015 and as a member of the Supervisory Council since December 2014; she was re-elected to both roles in early 2022. An economist by training, she earned her BA, MA, and PhD in Economics from the University of Tirana.

Her career spans academia and banking. She lectured in macroeconomics, microeconomics, and monetary economics, and served as Dean of the Trade Faculty at the public university in Vlora. Before joining the central bank's leadership, she moved into the financial sector, holding senior posts including Director of the Vlora Branch and Administrator at National Commercial Bank (BKT). She has authored numerous publications in economics and finance.



AHMET ISMAILI

Governor

Central Bank of the Republic of Kosovo

Dr. Ahmet Ismaili is Governor of the Central Bank of the Republic of Kosovo and Chair of its Executive Board. He also chairs the Management Board of the Deposit Insurance Fund and represents Kosovo on the IMF Board of Governors, serving as Alternate Governor at the World Bank Group.

With 20+ years in banking and finance, he has held senior management roles - including CEO and board member - across local and international institutions. His public service includes a full five-year mandate as Director-General of the State Treasury at the Ministry of Finance. Dr. Ismaili has taught banking and finance at the University of Prishtina and served nearly 15 years as a senior trainer with the Banking Association.



ANDREAS DOMBRET Global Senior Advisor Oliver Wyman

Andreas Dombret served on the Executive Board of the Deutsche Bundesbank from 2010 to 2018, overseeing financial stability, markets, statistics, banking supervision, economic education, risk control, and the Bank's international representation. As Bundesbank Deputy, he handled relations with the IMF, Germany's Financial Stability Commission, the ECB Supervisory Board, the Basel Committee on Banking Supervision, and sat on the BIS Board.

Earlier, he held senior roles at Deutsche Bank, JPMorgan, Rothschild, and Bank of America. Since 2009 he has been a professor at the European Business School and also teaches at Columbia University. Today, Dr. Dombret advises international firms—most prominently Oliver Wyman - on prudential policy, risk management, and financial-sector strategy.



JOHN VELISSARIOS Co-founder and Director Otranto Limited

With over 30 years in IT and financial services, John advises leading institutions on digital financial markets and money. His work spans CBDCs, stablecoins, and tokenized assets - covering strategy, solution design, implementation, and secure operation across complex, regulated environments.

Over the past 12 years, he has pioneered more than a dozen multi-year initiatives, including Sweden's e-krona, Kazakhstan's Digital Tenge, and Switzerland's SDX Digital Exchange. Recognized as a global authority on digital currency, he brings deep, hands-on expertise from pilots to production. John holds an undergraduate degree in computer science and a graduate degree in cryptography.



MARION LABOURE

Managing Director, Thematic Research Deutsche Bank

Marion Laboure is a Senior Economist at Deutsche Bank in London and a Lecturer at Harvard University. She brings cross-sector experience spanning private finance, public policy, and central banking, with previous roles at the European Commission, the IMF, the Central Bank of Luxembourg, and Barclays. Her research focuses on digital finance, payments, financial inclusion, and monetary policy.

Recognized among “45 Standout Women in Fintech,” she received first prize from the American Society of Actuaries; Revue Banque named her a rising star in finance, and Business Insider dubbed her a cryptocurrency “mastermind.” She is the author of *Democratising Finance* (Harvard University Press) and a frequent commentator on the future of money and technology.
